

Briarfield Academy Action Plan for 2021-22

Monitoring Students and Adults for Symptoms

- We are requiring that any COVID-19 test taken be **PCR** not rapid to establish student(s) attendance
 - No visitors will be allowed in the school building. Communication with the front office will be via telephone, email, or the front window
 - An isolation room will be used for
 - isolating anyone showing signs of illness until picked up by parent
 - students who return to school without a doctor's excuse following absence
- **Students may remain in the isolation room a maximum of 90 minutes while waiting to be picked up **or** for a doctor's excuse to be provided
- **Students experiencing ANY symptoms of illness are not allowed to come to school and MUST have a doctor's release BEFORE returning to school.**

Symptoms of Illness:

fever (greater than 100.0)	sore throat
cough	congestion/runny nose
shortness of breath	nausea, vomiting, diarrhea
muscle or body aches	fatigue
headache	loss of taste/smell

If students experience any of these symptoms while at school, they will be isolated from other students until they can be picked up. Students **MUST** be picked up immediately when a parent is called. <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.html>

What are the steps when a student or faculty member tests positive for COVID-19?

- Must have 24 hours with no fever without administering fever reducing medications
- Must have a doctor's release to return to school
- Parents will be notified by the school if their child has been exposed to COVID-19

What if I have a positive COVID-19 test and I have no symptoms?

- Must have a doctor release to return to school/work

What if a child/adult has had close contact* with someone in their household with COVID-19 and did not choose to take a COVID-19 test?

- Must have a doctor release to return to school/work

What if a child/adult has had close contact with someone in their household with COVID-19 and had a **NEGATIVE test result?**

- Must have a doctor's release before returning to school

What if a child has a negative test with symptoms? *Must meet both requirements*

- Must have NO fever for 24 hours without administering fever reducing medications
- Must have a doctor's release before returning to school

What if a person in a student's household gets tested for COVID-19?

- Students must remain home until family member gets test results
- Must have a doctor's release before returning to school

***Parents must notify Mrs. Lisa immediately if a student or a member of the student's household is tested for COVID-19 or receives a positive result. The individual's identity will remain confidential, however, students who are in close contact will need to be identified.**

Face Coverings

- Face coverings are optional for all students and staff
- No political statements or offensive language may be written on masks. No obscene, suggestive, or profane printing on masks

Student Learning: Traditional Setting

- Students and staff attend school 5 days a week
- Students/staff dealing with COVID-19 will be dealt with on a case to case basis
- Students are required to complete and submit assignments while learning from home

NOTICE OF RISK
